As of Friday, 49 of our households have made pledges or donations totaling \$24,145.00. This is 45% of the parish target of \$52,248.00. The involvement of all who can make a ten month pledge is especially encouraged. This allows the giver to do a little extra because it is spread out over a ten month period. The Appeal hopes to raise \$975,000 to fund 16 Diocesan Programs & Ministries for the 2011-2012 Fiscal year. The Ministries are: Camp St. Michael, Campus Newman Centers, Cardinal Newman Retreat Center, Department of Catholic Schools, Communication, Continuing Clergy Formation, Diocesan Pastoral Council, Hispanic Ministry, Native American Ministry, Deaconate, Religious Education, Restorative Justice, Tribunal, Child & Youth Protection Office, Vocations/Seminarians, and Youth Ministry.
